#### **Screening in Trauma for Opioid Misuse Prevention (STOMP)**

\$500,000

Goal: The long-term goal for this and future work is the dissemination of interventions effective in preventing opioid addiction and related complications, such as overdose. The research specifically aims to engage the high-risk population of traumatic injury victims to:

- 1) Examine (a) baseline patient demographics and physical and mental factors (b) measures of hypothesized risk factors for subsequent addiction collected at 4 weeks and 12 weeks post-injury, and (c) incident opioid use disorder in the 6 months after traumatic injury.
- 2) Develop a multivariate regression model using the most strongly associated variables from Aim 1 to predict opioid addiction risk after traumatic injury, and, thus, develop a parsimonious and implementable set of opioid risk screening items.
- 3) Pilot test the implementation of an opioid risk screening & misuse prevention protocol, making use of the instrument developed in Aims 1 and 2 at level I and II trauma centers in Wisconsin.

#### **Test of a Workforce Development Intervention to Expand Buprenorphine Prescribers**
