
Epidemic of opioid addiction and overdose deaths: a public health threat in the U.S. and Wisconsin

What is Addiction? American Society of Addiction Medicine 2011

 Addiction is a progressive, chronic disease that, unless treated, can lead to disability or premature death.

Heroin, Opiate Prevention and Education (HOPE)

- 445: ID when picking up opioid prescriptions
- 446: use of Naloxone by first responders
- 447: immunity when calling 911
- 448: regulations for MedDrop programs
- 668: expand Treatment Alternatives and Diversion programs
- 701: pilot treatment programs for underserved
- 702: "swift & certain" sanctions for parole violations

Law Enforcement

- Naloxone administration by first responders
 - Madison Police Dept covered the costs
 - First reversal: Nov 19, 2014 (one day after the training)
- The Dane County Narcotics Taskforce
 - in-kind police escort for drug disposal and incineration

Patient Advocacy


- Harm Reduction, Overdose Prevention
 - The AIDS Resource Center of Wisconsin
 - Naloxone overdose kits to drug users
 - Needle exchange

Patient-centered clinical care

- Evidence-based approach to care
 - for addiction
 - the ASAM placement criteria
 - multimodal treatment
 - for chronic pain
 - responsible opioid prescribing practices
 - multimodal treatment
- Care aligned with patient needs
 - -de-stigmatization of addiction treatment


