Jack M. Westfall, MD, MPH
Chief Medical Director, Colorado Health Cooperative
Director, High Plains Research Network
Professor, University of Colorado School of Medicine

Dr. Westfall serves as a Clinical Professor of Family Medicine for the University of Colorado School of Medicine, an institution where he has held multiple teaching appointments since 1995, served as Associate Dean for Rural Health from 2004 to 2013, and was the Patrick and Kathleen Thompson Endowed Chair in Rural Health from 2008 to 2013. Board certified in Family Practice, Dr. Westfall has served as a family physician at the Yuma Clinic in Yuma, Colorado, at the Plains Medical Center in Limon, Colorado, and for Rose Family Medicine in Denver. He is the Founder and Director of the High Plains Research Network (founded in 1997), an integrated practice-based research network of rural and frontier hospitals, clinics, and clinicians dedicated to improving medical care in rural Colorado. As the Director of HPRN, he has conducted research on a host of topics including cardiac care, palliative care, medical mistakes, colon cancer prevention, asthma, underinsurance, patient centered medical home, and integrated behavioral health. He has also served as Director of Community Engagement for the Colorado Clinical Translational Science Institute, a collaboration among the University of Colorado Denver, University of Colorado Boulder, and multiple healthcare and community organizations with a goal to accelerate the application of research into improved patient care and public health. In 2013, Dr. Westfall was named the Chief Medical Officer for the Colorado Health Cooperative, a nonprofit, member-governed health insurance cooperative.



Keynote Presenter

Mary Wellik, MPH, BSN, RN

Mary Wellik; MPH, BSN, is a consultant and former Director of Public Health in Olmsted County, Minnesota. She is a graduate of the University of Minnesota School of Nursing and School of Public Health. Ms. Wellik has practiced public health in the community setting, in clinic services and administration. Her practice has focused on strengthening community partnerships to improve health status, public health policy development, and developing children/family services. Ms. Wellik was a member of the IOM *Integration of Public Health and Primary Care* Committee, and, with the Chair, presented the report recommendations to key federal stakeholders. She has held numerous leadership positions including Chair of the Olmsted County United Way Community Impact Task Force; development of CHAC (Community Healthcare Access Collaborative), and the Olmsted County Collaborative Leadership Fellows Program; Co-Chair of the Minnesota eHealth Committee; Chair of the Local Public Health Assn. (LPHA) of Minnesota; and, co-chair of the LPHA Legislative Committee. She has been a participant in the national Turning Point Public Health Leadership Development Collaborative, and served on the NACCHO Informatics Workgroup and Mayo Clinic Beacon Initiative for SE Minnesota Governance Board. She is currently working with rural communities in Minnesota to implement electronic communication between health systems and community partners through the Community Transformation Grant.
