Her professional work has focused on improving the health of American Indian and Alaskan Native health communities always with a community-led focus. She has developed tribal and urban health programs and resources with a strong focus on evaluation and research in order to develop an evidence base for what works in Native communities. She is the CEO of the American Indian Cancer Foundation, a national organization dedicated to capacity building solutions based in tribal wisdom to eliminate cancer burdens faced by American Indian and Alaska Native people.
